



EVENT: KEYSPOt Open Houses

In the upcoming weeks, [KEYSPOT](#) will hold two open houses to allow people to learn about free computer access, education, and job preparation resources offered by the program.

KEYSPOT is a citywide coalition of community-based groups who are committed to bringing Internet access, digital literacy and technology to all Philadelphia communities. There are 51 KEYSPOt locations: 19 are located in City Recreation Centers; four sites are staffed by the Free Library of Philadelphia, and the rest are managed by 28 neighborhood-based organizations located across the city.

The first open house will be held at [Diversified Community Services](#)'s Dixon House at 1920 S. 20th St. on Wednesday, October 22 from 4:00-7:00 p.m.

On Tuesday, October 28, from 4:00-7:00 p.m., Drexel University's [Dornsife Center](#) at 3509 Spring Garden St. Philadelphia, PA 19104, will host the second open house.

Attendees will also have the opportunity to participate in a Q&A session with KEYSPOt staff and clients, and learn how KEYSPOts are helping put Philadelphia's job-seekers to work.
